UUA REINVESTS IN DRUUMM

After nearly a decade of disinvestment by the UUA in DRUUMM, the oldest and largest Unitarian Universalist People of Color organization, DRUUMM President Rev. Ranwa Hammamy and UUA President Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray with support of the UUA Board of Trustees announced a renewal of the partnership that started in 1997.

DRUUMM had served as a primary accountability mechanism for the UUA's Journey Towards Wholeness commitment, and a vibrant and growing community for UU People of Color that provided mutual support and ongoing spiritual growth. The renewal includes restoring ongoing funding for DRUUMM administrative operations, that had diminished under UUA President Rev. Bill Sinkford and was eventually zeroed out under Rev. Peter Morales. DRUUMM received around \$5000 several years ago, and this will increase to \$50,000 for 2018-2019.

DRUUMM leadership has been consistently meeting and coordinating with UUA and sister groups including Black Lives of UU in order to find a sustainable way forward as an allvolunteer led organization. Resources will be used to sharpen a more comprehensive long-term plan.


